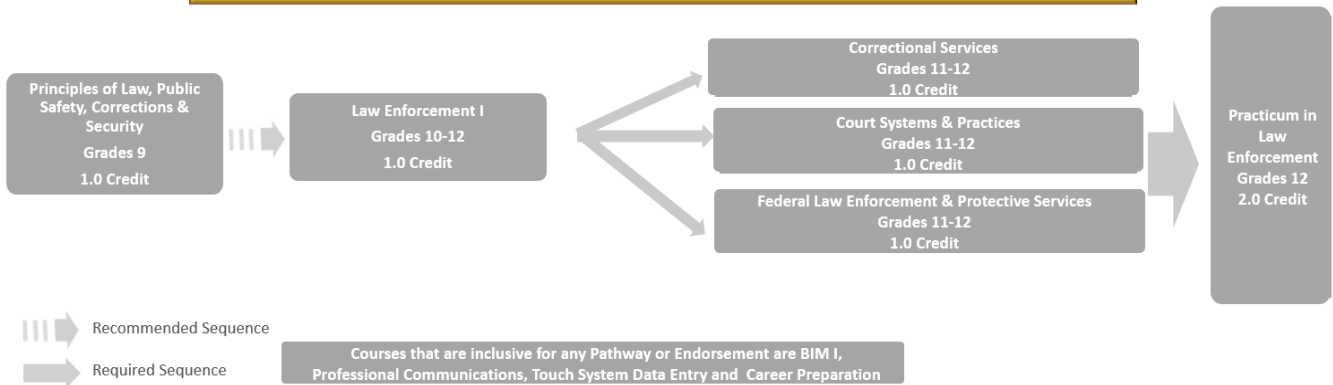


# Public Service Pathway – Criminal Justice



## PRINCIPLES OF LAW, PUBLIC SAFETY, CORRECTIONS AND SECURITIES

Students will gain knowledge of professions in law enforcement, protective services, corrections, firefighting, and emergency management services. Students will examine the roles and responsibilities of police, courts, corrections, private security, and protective agencies of fire and emergency services.

## LAW ENFORCEMENT I

**Prerequisite:** None

Students will develop an introductory knowledge of the history, organization, and functions of local, state, and federal law enforcement. Students will understand the role of constitutional law at local, state, and federal levels; the U.S. legal system; criminal law; and law enforcement terminology and the classification and elements of crime.
